Part A: Curriculum music

- At Padfield Primary School we use Charanga in timetabled 40 minute music lessons.
All core elements of the National Curriculum for music are delivered within each music lesson.
- We also part-take in whole school singing assemblies weekly which follow a planned progression.
- We sing daily in assemblies as well.
- In Year 4, children take part in Derbyshire Wider Opportunities music teaching where they will learn to play an instrument.

Part B: Co-curricular music

- At Padfield children have the choice to take part in a weekly choir which runs after school with a goal to perform at local events.
- We also have visiting musicians who offer piano, clarinet, brass and guitar private and group lessons.

- We are linked with Derbyshire Music Partnership, Greater Music Hub and also with Charanga who consult us on our music curriculum.

Part C: Musical experiences

- Key stage 2 go annually to Glossopdale Secondary School to watch musical performances performed by older students.
- We visit local performances when they are offered to us such as The Snowman at Buxton Theatre, performed by a live orchestra.
- Reception children have been to watch Musical Beasts at St. James' Church in Glossop and this happens annually.
- We all prepare for performances such as nativity plays, carol concerts, class assemblies and the end of Key Stage 2 play.

In the future

- To develop a school choir which, in time, will take part in local and regional festivals and performances
- To raise staff confidence in teaching music
- To review and develop our Charanga curriculum to make it more bespoke for our school.
- To build on our relationship with the local Music Hubs and offer more music lessons to the children.
- To have termly performances showcasing the children's musical learning and talent.
